

U.S. AFRICA LEADERS SUMMIT



In late 2022, PIMD joined the State Department and the White House to participate in the U.S. Africa Leaders Summit. During a panel discussion entitled: **Preparing the Future Workforce for Tomorrow's Careers,** PIMD presented its model for strengthening workforce development, organizational capacity, and improving services delivery of local organizations.

This conversation showcased transformations in higher education necessary to create pipelines of opportunity and address the needs of tomorrow's global workforce. Partnerships of PIMD and of organizations such as the U.S. Embassy in Dakar, illustrates impactful models that demonstrates the U.S. Government's commitment to leveraging the strengths and capacities of closer U.S.-Africa relationships at the institutional and people-to-people level

AFRICAN UNION

Against the backdrop of the U.S. Africa Leaders Summit, PIMD joined the African Union Mission to the United States and the African Union Youth Envoy's agenda for a consultative forum of the African and Diaspora Youth Leaders.

The African diaspora contributes to significant knowledge transfer and partnership development with African countries, which play a central role in unlocking the potential of youth and economies. Through our Good Governance Practice Program (GGPP), our partnership and collaboration between local government, civil society organizations, and the citizenry provides opportunities to enhance government accountability and transparency and promote good governance practice and access to information.



PIMD strengthens the fundamental building blocks of the local organization by leveraging the expertise of the diaspora, national, and international partners to provide platforms and tools to assist municipal managers in acquiring advanced training, knowledge, and skills necessary to meet the needs of local communities.

GGPP

In 2023, PIMD implemented three successful Good Governance Practice Programs (GGPP) in Guinea-Bissau. In partnership with the U.S. Embassy in Dakar, GGPP promotes good governance practices in developing countries through hands-on practical training, capstone practicum research, and leadership development. During three sessions of help in Guinea-Bissau, PIMD trained approximately 70 participants, including women leaders, members of civil society, journalists, and public sector officials.

Post-program evaluations indicate that over 93% of participants expressed satisfaction with the program and found it relevant to their professional goals and the current political context in Guinea-Bissau. This represents a 10% increase in program satisfaction from the previous year.



GGPP FOCUS: PAPE CISSÉ, Ph.D.



As a seasoned executive with the federal government, Dr. Pape Cissé leads the formulation and administration of policy and operational activities that promote the effective and efficient utilization of computer technology systems, networks, and equipment. As a former Obama appointee, Dr. Cissé served as Strategic Advisor to the Associate Administrator for Administration and Chief Information Officer at the US Department of Transportation Office of the Assistant Secretary for Research (OST-R). He is a recipient of a post-doctoral degree from Harvard University.

Dr. Cissé's leadership, tact, and skills in our GGPP programs in Guinea-Bissau demonstrate the African diaspora's commitment and contribution to knowledge transfer, capacity building, and leadership development in African countries.

GGEL

The Good Governance Executive Leadership Program (GGEL) invites senior government officials from African countries to the United States for a 10-day, high-caliber leadership development training, peer-to-peer learning, and exchanges on best practices in local government. In 2023, PIMD hosted its second annual GGEL program-themed **Strengthening the Building Blocks of Democracy.** It included participation from Suzie Ludlow, former City Manager for the City of Takoma Park, and state department officials, as well as engagements with members of Congress. GGEL has become one of our most popular programs since the creation of PIMD and allows local government officials in Africa to strengthen collaboration with international organizations and partners.

GGEL highlights the importance of good governance practice at the local level and promotes critical thinking, peer-to-peer learning, and perspectives from best practices and models.



GGEL FOCUS: Elisabeth R. Myers, J.D.



With almost 30 years of legal experience, Elisabeth R. Myers, J.D. has served as a strategic advisor and general counsel for non-profit organizations on Morocco and U.S.-Morocco business issues.

Previously a partner in large US law firms, she has been a mentor and coach for Growth Train Africa, an international advisor for CodeHER's international initiative, and Chair of the Women's Entrepreneurship Initiative of the Middle East and North Africa Consultants Association. A frequent speaker and lecturer worldwide, Elisabeth has presented seminars, webinars, online courses, and internal training sessions for US and foreign regulatory agencies and universities. As an educator, Elisabeth has been an Adjunct Associate Professor of Law at the American University's Washington College of Law.

PIMD AT YALE

In 2023, PIMD joined Yale University for its **Leadership Forum for Strategic Impact**, which convenes women in senior governmental positions across the continent to amplify their effectiveness and impact. PIMD patterned with Yale University to co-design and facilitate a high-caliber simulation exercise for participants, with real-life scenarios, to enable discussions on key issues faced by women in leadership roles worldwide, sharing perspectives from their own work in senior roles in government across Africa.

gov-HERnment

gov-HERnment is designed to bridge leadership and opportunity gaps for women in local government and the public sector. In 2023, PIMD launched its inaugural gov-HERnment in Patte D'oie, Senegal, in partnership with Maimouna Dieye (former Mayor of Patte D'oie), current Minister for Family and Solidarity for the Republic of Senegal. gov-HERnment tackles critical leadership challenges women face, including cultural and socio-economic barriers hindering their access and success. Dr. Janette Yarwood, Director for Africa and the Middle East at Yale University, served as our inaugural speaker and presenter.
